#### FROM PASTOR BLAIR'S DESK

MAY 2025

Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb. - John 20:11 (NRSV)

Mary was frightened that first Easter morning. She had gone to do what would have been a painful but routine chore. It was the task of preparing the body of her slain master. She did not relish doing it but it had to be done and she would rather her doing it than some stranger. But then everything was different. The stone had been rolled away which told her the tomb had been disturbed. She did not want to look into the tomb. She was afraid of what she might see. But she had to bend down and see what was inside. She could not stand the idea of not knowing. Her lord was too important to her.

Sometimes, we would rather not do something that we know has to be done. It may be too hard. It may be too painful. It may be too much; more than we think we can handle. We know that for us to be able to do this thing, we may need to bend down and look where we do not want to look. We may have to face something inside of us that we have often dismissed or ignored.

But the way of Jesus calls from us the humility and courage to do those things that we may first choose not today. The way of Jesus calls from us an openness and honesty with ourselves that enables us to be honest with God. The gospel is that God through Jesus is with us in our bending down and our facing up to life's challenges. Through our honesty and humility we are not just given a fresh glimpse into ourselves but a greater understanding of God's love and understanding.

Mary was rewarded with the Good News when she had the courage to bend down and look into the tomb. So are we given the Good News of being loved and forgiven when we bend down and look at ourselves. May we all find the peace of God's love and mercy in this Easter season.

Next Come to Supper will Be Wed. May 14th at 5:30p


